

This year I (Joel) will celebrate my seventy-second Christmas, Lord willing.

Jeannie and I are looking forward to spending our Christmas vacation at our home in Texas.

We are anxious to see our Texas children and grandchildren again. But my broken foot means we probably cannot travel beyond Texas!

Every year I appreciate something fresh about the Christmas story. This year I am hearing the Christmas story as an invitation to imagine, dream, and serve.

In many ways this might not seem like a time to imagine and dream – much less to commit oneself to serving God's audacious purpose to redeem and restore what sin has damaged.

I do not need to tell you that our world is in turmoil. I write this only days after the South Korean president declared martial law in the middle of the night and then just as abruptly withdrew his order. (South Korea made world headlines!)

And certainly, both Jeannie and I are aware that we will have increasing limitations as we grow older. The cast on my foot doesn't let me forget that! You could cite examples in your own life! One could argue that this is not a time to dream, imagine, much less serve what at times might seem to be God's impossible dream.

But yet

There is something I noted this year. The passages we read in the Christmas season seem to place side by side God's faithfulness to his past covenant promises and his often surprising, unexpected ways of fulfilling those same promises. You might even conclude that God specializes in fulfilling promises when the future appears to be the darkest. And not only that. God seems to use the most unlikely people to fulfill his promises.

Take the prophesy in Micah 5: 2-5a. Micah prophesied during a time in which Israel and Judah were being threatened by the powerful armies of Assyria. One would not naturally think of this as a time to dream and imagine. Yet in Micah's God-breathed imagination he sees a Savior. But this Savior will not come from Jerusalem. He will not come from the expected places. Like David he will come from the out of the way town of Bethlehem. Like David he will be a shepherd who truly cares and provides for his flock.

I am learning again that nothing in Jeannie and my ministry is about us. Nor is it about the skill of our staff and teachers at Grace and Little Lambs. It is not even about the dedication of our parents.

It is about God. It is about God's faithfulness and grace. It is about the surprising ways God acts. It is about the unexpected people God uses to bring his Kingdom into our world of turmoil and confusion.

But here is the paradox of the Christmas story. The fact that it is all about God does not make us passive. Rather it is just the opposite. God's grace frees us to imagine and dream. God's grace liberates us to participate in God's purposes in our neighborhoods and around the world.

We wish all of you a joyful Christmas as you dream, Imagine and serve in the astounding freedom of God's grace and faithfulness. Merry Christmas!
